

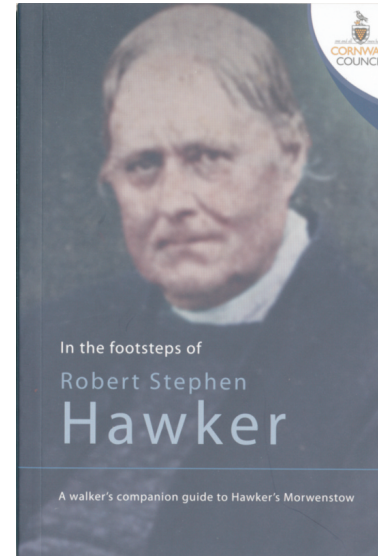
### Bude Circular Walk 60p

**Distance:** Approx. 7 miles

**Time:** Allow 4 hours

**Terrain:** Some pavement, coastal footpath and country lanes.

**Info:** This historically rich 7 mile walk is filled with varied scenery and panoramic views. The level path follows the Bude Canal, a remarkable relic of C19th engineering to its terminal as a barge waterway. The wide open views from the fields of Whalesborough overlooking Widemouth Bay and the rugged cliffline to the south are without doubt breathtaking, especially when the surf pounds the coast. Then there are the clifftops with their dramatic, geological formations, leading you to views overlooking Bude, its bay and beyond to Hartland and Exmoor. This circular walk is a must for anyone wishing to discover Bude's surrounding landscape, its beauty and unique history.

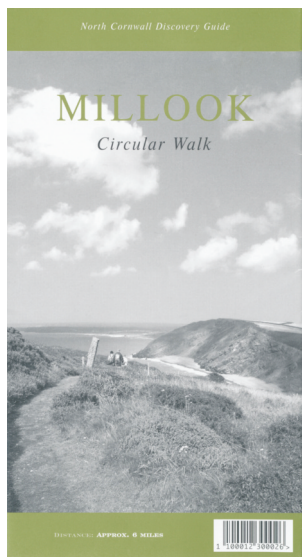

### Millook Circular Walk 60p

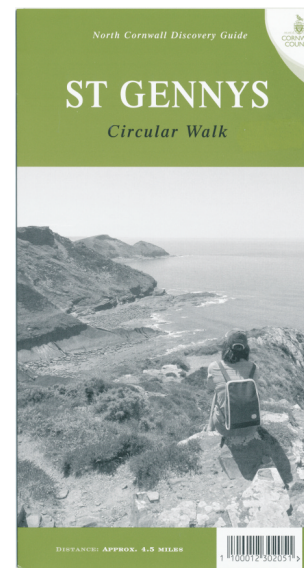
**Distance:** Approx. 5 miles

**Time:** Allow 3 hour

**Terrain:** Country lanes and farmland

**Info:** This 5 mile walk takes you through one of the most beautiful, remote and interesting areas in the whole of Cornwall. The ancient woodlands of the Millook valley offer a splendid contrast to the breathtaking cliff top views above the prehistoric stunted woods of the Dizzard.

### St. Gennys Circular Walk 60p

**Distance:** Approx. 4 ½ miles

**Time:** Allow 3 hours

**Terrain:** Variety of coastal and country paths, and pavements. Some slopes.

**Info:** This wonderful 4 ½ mile walk leads you to the core of the ancient parish of St. Gennys, namely the small village of Churchtown. Perched amongst a remarkable undulating landscape, high above the rugged coast and overlooking Bude Bay, the hamlet and its surrounds have changes little in the past centuries. Magnificent coastal scenery is encountered along the walk with Tintagel visible to the south and to the north Bude, Hartland Point, Lundy Island and even the coast of Wales on clear days.
