**Distance:** Approx. 3 ½ miles

**Time:** Allow 2 hours

**Terrain:** Mainly tarmac, some coastal footpath and a few very steep slopes.

**Info:** This walk will help guide you on a 3 ½ mile tour which will unveil the rich and hidden history of Boscastle step by step. This is a stroll around the fascinating village of Boscastle illustrating the history of the village as well as identifying some of the jewels of the local architecture. This trail will lead you to parts of the village that you otherwise might have missed.

**Distance:** Approx. 3 miles

**Time:** Allow 2 hours

**Terrain:** Village streets, coastal footpaths, country lanes and a couple of steep slopes.

**Info:** This varied 3 mile walk from the main street down to the Island and the sea is a journey through Tintagel's history. The unabashed commercialism of the Twentieth Century, the romance of the Victorian Era, the politics of the Middle Ages and the shadow of the Dark Ages, have all left their mark on Tintagel.

### Port Isaac Village Trail

**Distance:** Approx. 1 ½ miles

**Time:** Allow 2 hours

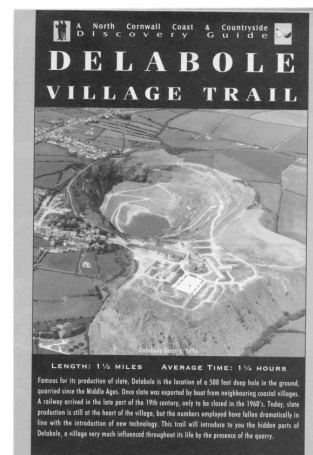
**Terrain:** Mainly tarmac with some steep slopes in places.

**Info:** Narrow streets wind their way between cottages, many of which display superb examples of local building styles. The roofs undulate up the valley slopes, occasionally taller houses peeping above the roof line for a better view of the sea. This village is well worth exploring and this 1 ½ mile trail allows you to discover the hidden gems of Port Isaac.

### Delabole Village Trail

**Distance:** Approx. 1 ½ miles

**Time:** Allow 1 ¼ hours

**Terrain:** Mainly pavement and some slopes

**Info:** Famous for its production of slate, Delabole is the location of a 500 feet deep hole in the ground, quarried since the Middle Ages. Once slate was exported by boat from neighbouring coastal villages. A railway arrived in the late part of the 19th Century, only to be closed in the 1960's. Today, slate production is still at the heart of the village, but the numbers employed have fallen dramatically in line with the introduction of new technology. This 1 ½ mile trail will introduce you to the hidden parts of Delabole, a village very much influenced throughout its life by the presence of the quarry.
